Western redcedar are long-lived trees that grow to greater than 200 feet in height and 10 feet in diameter and are common in the Pacific Northwest. Our old-growth western redcedar is salvaged from trees that were felled naturally due to high winds and/or old age. Therefore, while not reclaimed from a previous structure, no living trees were cut down for this product. Known for its tight, straight grain, few knots, and natural resistance to decay, it is ideally suited for siding and decking. Naturally it has a soft red-brown color, but can also be stained to suit your design. We have both select tight knot (STK) and clear vertical grain (CVG) grades.

This siding can be applied in various patterns, including board to board, board and batten, reverse board and batten, and board on board. We also offer ship lap and tongue and groove mill profiles. The decking can be used as is in the rough or can be surfaced on all four sides (S4S) with an eased edge.
